- Dramatic situations lead to dramatic solutions, like alcohol consumption, abuse & social exclusion.

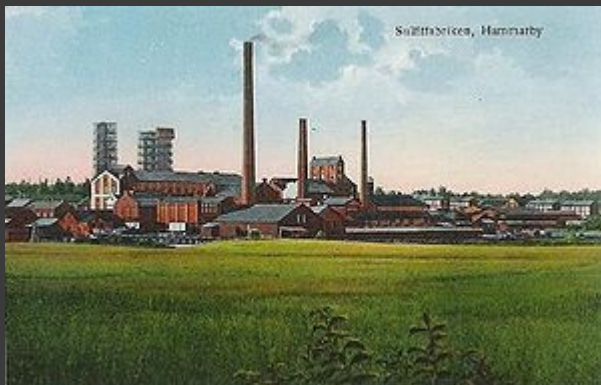

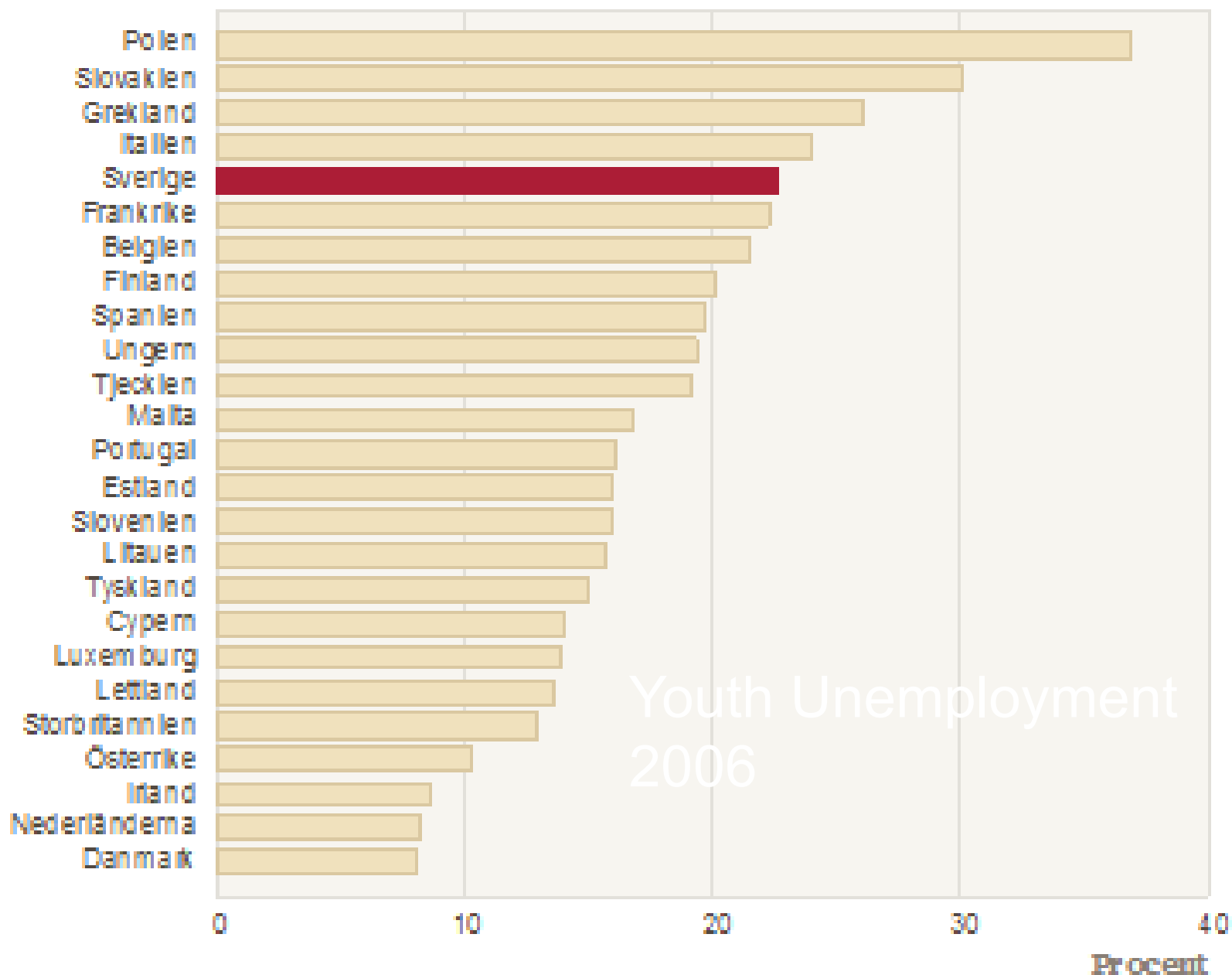

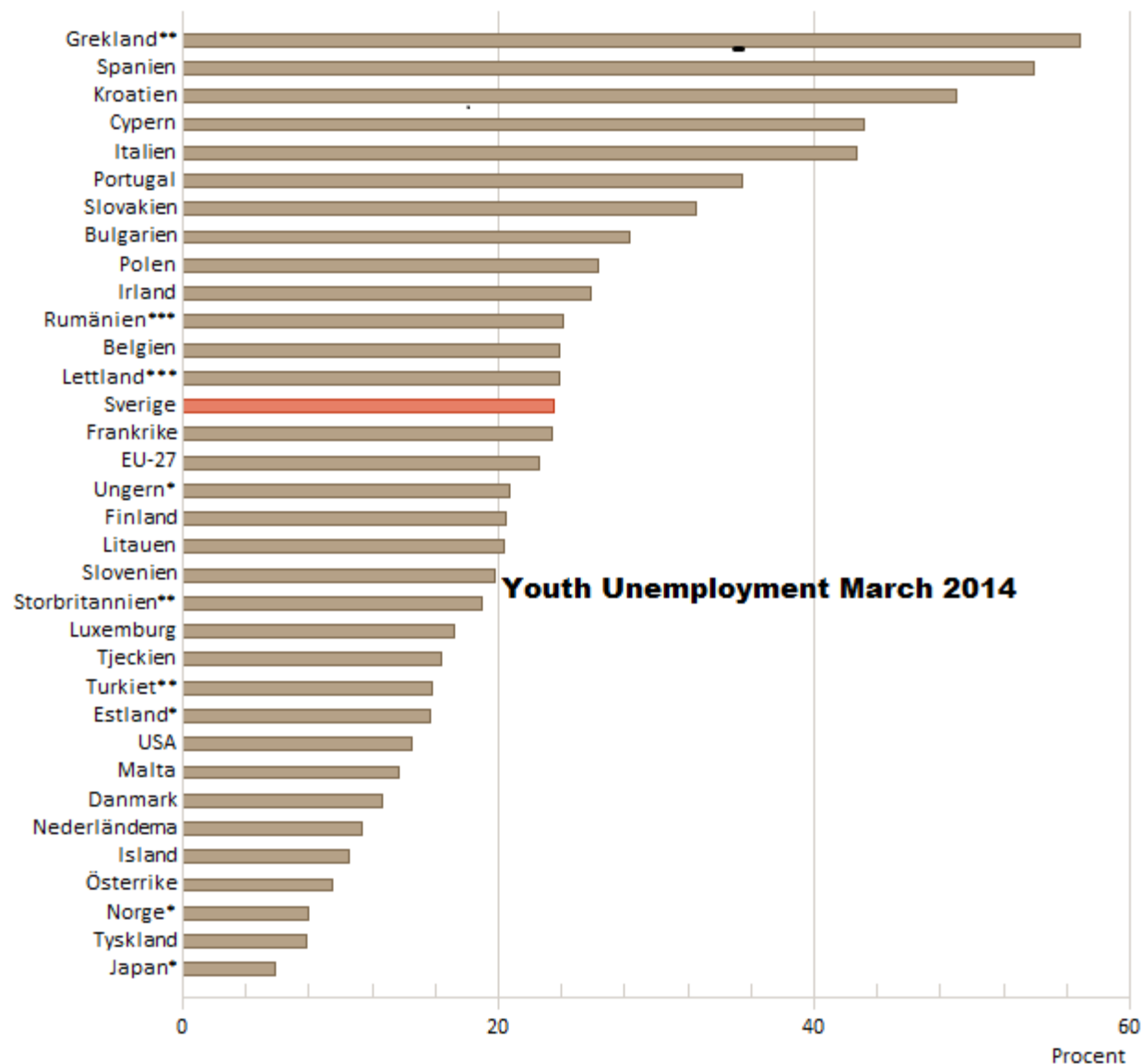

We will put these activities into practice to check effectiveness. Examples: group dynamics, workshops, debates, meetings with psychologists, alcoholics, health institutions, etc.

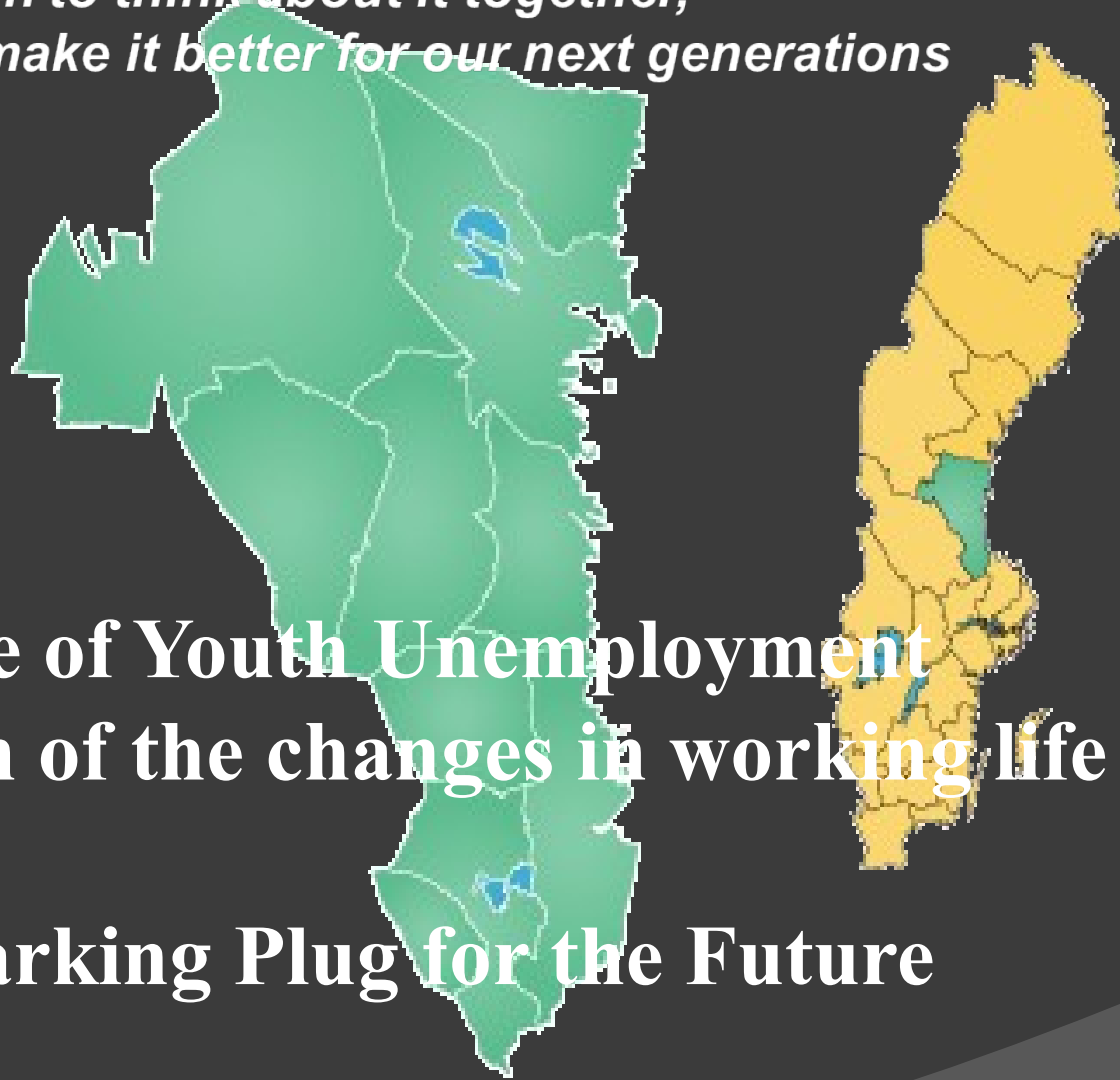
